The College are proud to have been the only school from any educational sector in South Australia to be nationally awarded, or receive commendation status, across the eight categories of the national awards.

We continue to grow and connect in different ways within our community to improve the services at the College including our new bus services affiliation with LinkSA, our new uniform association with Hills Schoolwear and our new canteen relationship with Rory's School Lunches all of which are providing better services for our families and students. The Fathering Project is another example of connecting communities. Providing an environment for fathers to connect, helping dads to be the best dads they can be, for themselves, their children and their families. The Fathering Project provides a place to connect, become more aware and mobilises fathers and families to create brighter futures for children. Guided by the needs of our community, we are encouraging and supporting fathers and father figures to put fathering first, get involved and be visible at the College. We've had a number of successful events over the past 12 months and will continue to into the future.

The College remains fiscally strong and with some financial uncertainty in the market it's great to report that the fees for 2021 and 2022 have remained the same for all year levels, which I am sure is welcomed by all families as a result of Catholic Education South Australia's continued work to make education more affordable.

With so much growth and change, comes the need for authentic and inspirational leadership and with that we welcomed our two new deputies, James Gill and Paul Wadsworth along with six Education Support Officers and 14 new teachers.
