# From the Deputy Principal - Community and Wellbeing

### That's Your Inner Voice Talking To You

The inner voice is a fascinating development in humans. Infant children can be so innocently caught up in the own parallel universe that they appear completely oblivious to what is going on around them. They need an adult to guide and direct them and it is awesome from a parent perspective to see them master tasks for themselves and develop their own character. The inner voice of an infant child, at its purest, is joyful to watch but as children grow and develop, the inner voice develops a power of its own.

As we get older, we talk to ourselves all the time. The voice in our head helps guide our decision making and helps us believe in our ability to cope and manage sometimes tricky situations. Encouraging positive self-talk with I can or I will statements helps build confidence, inner strength and self-esteem. Sometimes our inner voice can be harsh on us and while it is ok to be angry when things don't always go our way, we need to develop the capacity to forgive ourselves too. Keeping our inner voice in check is key to maintaining a growth mindset and it helps us to be who we are and be that well.

Children and teenagers of today's generation are bombarded with images and messages that can challenge how they feel about themselves. Social media and particularly chat platforms, can send the inner voice into overdrive. This can have a powerful effect on how a young person feels, responds and reacts. Events and conversations are re-lived and elaborated on, exaggerated and pulled apart. The outcomes can be devastating for relationships and self-esteem. Positive self-talk and maintaining trusting relationships with important adults can only help young people to negotiate the tricky years of adolescence.

Children and young people need boundaries around social media and breaks from screen time are extremely important. Responsible use of technology is a huge challenge for the adolescent brain. Adults need to rise to this challenge with their children to support them when things go awry and guide them when the bombarding is taking over.

A healthy inner voice leads to positive choices and happy kids and that has to be good for all of us.

Good luck to all of our students attending camp for the first time. The Year 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 students will all be out and about in the coming weeks and months. Time with friends and classmates away from screens and social media will offer plenty of good memories and fun times.

"We should be shining lamps, giving light to all around us." This quote from Catherine McAuley, the founder of the Sisters of Mercy, brings us hope as we begin Term 3 – our Mercy Mission term. Catherine's message inspires us to use our gifts and talents in the service of others. This will be emphasised in Week 10, as we celebrate College Day as our Mercy fundraiser, raising much needed funds for Catherine House. This organisation offers crisis, longer term accommodation and support services for women experiencing homelessness. A very worthy cause. More information will be presented soon about College Day.

### **Keepers of our Outdoor Environment**

This term, we have rolled out the Genesis Project, which is already making a noticeable positive impact on our call to be custodians of our natural world. Each year level from R-12 has been allocated an outdoor area of the College that they are responsible for, in relation to keeping it clean and tidy. In most cases, this is zoned in learning community groups. Every person at the College is a custodian of their zone and they have the privilege to ensure that it is free of litter and that the bin stations within it are used correctly. At the end of each term, the learning community who is most consistent in keeping their zone clean and tidy, including correct use of the bin stations, will be awarded the Genesis Trophy. One for the Junior School and one for the Senior School.

There will also be an Eden Award (one for the Junior School and one for the Senior School), presented fortnightly. In the even weeks of a given term, they will be awarded to the learning community who has demonstrated consistent custodianship of their zone in the two weeks prior. The Eden Award will be placed on the prayer table of each of the Home classes of the learning community on rotation, within the two week period. This is a special prayer focus for the Home class who is caring for the Eden Award. A huge thank you to Branden Hill, Learning Area Specialist - Technologies, for making the physical Eden Award and Genesis Trophy for us.

It is my pleasure to announce that at the end of Week 4 this term, the Eden Awards have been presented to the Year 1 and 2 Learning Community and the Year 12 community. Congratulations to those students and staff for their dedicated work in being custodians of our outdoor environment!

#### Vinnies Winter Appeal and Sleepout

We wrapped up last term bringing the Vinnies Winter Appeal to a conclusion. A huge thank you to all in our College community for your generous commitment to our Vinnies Winter Appeal. 



In the Savoy and Padua learning spaces our aim is to provide the children with tools to show an increasing capacity to understand, self-regulate and manage their emotions in ways that reflect the feelings and needs of others. We will be doing this by exploring and naming our feelings and discussing how our actions can impact others. Our hope for the children is that they gradually learn to read the behaviours of others and respond appropriately, and develop positive relationships with their peers. In the Geneva and Lyon learning spaces we are focusing on developing independence in self-care, emotional regulation, exploring new situations and agency in learning. We will be doing this by visiting the local community, teaching new skills, role modelling and using the children's interests as a vehicle to acquire new skills and further self-confidence. Our hope for the children is that as they learn new skills they see them selves as capable and competent learners with boundless potential.
